Reading, 'Riting, & 'Rithmetic . . . And More! by Jim Sigmund

As another school year begins, it seems like a good time to reflect on how learning has changed over the years in this area. We smile at the class pictures from the one-room schools in the 1920's, with the children looking like they came right out of a Little Rascals episode! But even as the schools consolidated in the late 1930's and children moved into "modern" classrooms, an occasional pair of bare feet can still be seen peeking out from the desks. That's mostly the boys, though, as the girls are usually dressed in pretty dresses, with bows in their hair!

The real contrast is the difference in subject matter, as reflected in the early report cards. Practical and vocational learning was just as important as "book-learning" to the young students. The "Home Report" assured that chores were done, and that children learned a variety of skills that were important in their home, and to life on the farm.
