- The only transportation for school was one large passenger car that carried a few students from Cypress to school?
- You could count the number in your class with the fingers of one hand and have two left over?
- The teachers in 1932 numbered three, including Mr. Millsap?
- The community schools of Brink, Winkler, Sewell, Fuchs, Neidorf, Rosehill and Fairbanks were consolidated with Cypress School?
- The Consolidation of Cypress-Fairbanks in 1939-1940 had such an impact on the community as well as making it one of the largest independent schools in the state, area wise?
- Calvin Hargrave, Eddie Juergen and Willie Roebeck were our first bus drivers?
- How proud we were when the Home Economic and Vocational Agriculture departments were added to our School?
- Lillian Stockton instilled in us her expertise in typing shorthand and business skills?
- How proud and wonderful we looked in the beautiful new maroon & white satin basketball and volleyball suits and sweat suits in 1938?
- The addition of the first school band, uniforms and director, the first football team, uniforms and coach gave us such pride?
- The night of the sports awards banquet that Mary Purvis and Forest Arnold announced their engagement and how happy we were for them?
- We had such exciting basketball games with Klein, Addicks, Alief, Tomball, Waller and Spring along with others?
- The many county meets for Tennis, Choir, Speech, debates one act plays, softball, track, basketball and Volley ball. How much fun they were?
- The beauty of our new gymnasium floor--No one entered with out Tennis shoes, bare feet, or sock feet--We didn't dare break this rule!
- The day Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt visited the Cypress Campus to inspect the results of the N.Y.A. project of the school building arid teacherage which had just been completed.
- When Mr. & Mrs. Dunkerly first began serving lunches at school? What a wonderful change from the bag lunches for those whose parents could afford it.--Not many could.
- Did you attend the chivaree for the Claude Smiths when they lived at Satsuma? How Exciting!!!!
- Mr. Vandervinter was the staunch and dependable custodian for our school and how we all learned the song "The Yellow Rose of Texas" from him singing it as he pushed the broom?
- You felt that your class was without a doubt the best class to graduate from this school?
- The sad and terrible day of the big fire which destroyed the building of which we were so proud and housed so many wonderful memories.

### **Education Update**

We have been quite busy since our last newsletter. Presentations on "The Early History of Cypress" were made to the Cy-Fair Women's Network and later to the Towne Lakes Women's Organization. The presentations included a PowerPoint on the history of the area as well as viewing a number of artifacts from our library's collection. Another twosession workshop was held at Lone Star College. This workshop had participants create model historic buildings from the Cypress area. A "step-by-step" PowerPoint created at CHS was used to demonstrate building with cardboard. Additional workshops are scheduled for next year.

CHS has been actively involved with the Houston Archeological Society. Members have worked digs at Kleb Woods and have done "shovel testing" at San Filipe de Austin. They have also been helping as docents for the Elmer Kleb House for festivals and various school groups.

CHS hosted a two-day visit to CHS and Cypress Top Historic Park for the "Daisy Scouts". These youngsters are between the ages of 5 and 6. They toured the park on Saturday with their parents and were able to play the washboards in a Zydeco band at the park. The following Tuesday they

Finally, we are getting ready for our Third Annual "Hands-On-History" Camp. The camp is run by CHS and co-sponsored by Cypress Top Historic Park and Kleb Woods Nature Preserve and Farm. The camp will run from June 24th to June 28th. CHS members Jay Gavitt, and Christopher Fonte have been working along with Uyen Tong on preparations for the camp. Campers will explore the Cypress area's history by taking part in a number of activities during the week. A portion of the camp will be set aside for campers to explore their family trees as well as interviewing long-time CHS members. The final day will be devoted to the campers explaining their the museum exhibits they created during the week and giving individual tours for family and friends.
